

# Before you Search on Google Scholar set up your laptop / computer to link more seamlessly to UKZN resources and Endnote


## Why?


- To link to articles in UKZN Library databases
- To link to the UKZN library iCatalogue
- To create a link to export to Endnote

## Setting up features

Enter your search query in the Google Scholar search box and at the results page do the following to set up links:


### Endnote links

- Click on the *menu* icon on the top left of the screen: 
- Click on *settings* (may appear on the bottom or top left of the screen)  
Scroll down to *bibliography manager*. Click 'Show links to import citations into' and then choose *Endnote* from the drop down menu. Click *Save*.




### Link to UKZN Library catalogue and databases


- Still under Settings, click on *Library links* from top left of screen
- In the search box type in University of KwaZulu-Natal
- Once you have done so tick against the options below the search box to confirm these links if not already ticked (Open WorldCat and UKZN library). Then click *Save*.









## Viewing the links in the results

When you are at the results page in response to a search, note the last line of options in blue at the bottom of each result:

1. Click on **'Import into Endnote'** to send the reference details to your Endnote library
2. If an **item is available via UKZN library databases**, the link will appear on the right hand side of the reference details **Fulltext@UKZN**
3. To see if the item such as a book is listed in the **UKZN library catalogue**, click on the **double blue arrows** next to 'Import into Endnote' **Import into EndNote** . The arrows will change to **'Library search'**. Click on this and at the next page click on 'Continue' if you do not go immediately to the Library catalogue.
